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Listening: Open Day a) Presenting the School

It was Open Day at Simon's new school and so he went with his parents to see what the school was like. All the parents and new pupils first went on a tour of the school:

Welcome to King's School... I'm Mrs. Brown and I teach German and Spanish. I'm also head of the language department and responsible for international contacts. Let me take you on a tour of the school and if you have any questions don't be afraid to ask. ...

As you can see, we're starting our tour at the Assembly Hall where we always meet on Mondays before class. We have information noticeboards, but before the school week begins we like to get together for important announcements and to sort out any general problems.

Behind us there's a beautiful stage where we have performances at the end of term and where the band practice takes place. We have two bands: a junior band and a concert band. Perhaps one of the new pupils here would like to join the band or may want to learn how to play a musical instrument. After the tour you can speak to one of the music teachers about that.

We'll first go to the science rooms and I'll show you one of the classrooms. All our pupils use laptops at the school. They lease them and so if there is a problem, we can easily exchange them for repairs and the pupils get a new laptop after three years. At the end of the tour we'll go to the IT department where Mr. Sampson can give you more information on that.

Now, if you'd like to follow me upstairs, please... Here we are in one of the classrooms. All of the rooms have internet access and a white board. We also have an extra room for group work on each floor. The science department is on this floor, too. Over there you can see the Chemistry room and the Chemistry teacher, Mr. Martin, who's doing an experiment with one of the older pupils. You can come back later after the tour if that interests you.

As you can see through the window over here we also have a big gym. The pupils can do the typical school sports like basketball or football, but we also have three tennis courts outside and the local swimming baths are about five minutes on foot from here. Rowing is another favourite sport that's offered in one of the clubs. So there is plenty of choice.

Let's now go downstairs to the language department... This is the language department. As you've perhaps heard, we are a very internationally orientated school and offer bilingual classes where pupils can choose to take some subjects like Geography in French. You can also learn other languages such as Spanish, German, Russian and Chinese. We have exchanges with China, Japan, the USA, Canada, Russia, Portugal, Turkey, Finland and Germany. Every pupil must go on at least one exchange trip.

There are several extra-curricular activities such as hockey and chess. We also have a robot club, a Maths club and a debating club. We have a big theatre group that, as I mentioned earlier, puts on a performance every year at the end of term. We even have an animal help club.

Please follow me now and I'll show you the cafeteria where the pupils can spend their free periods and breaks. Warm meals or salads are offered in the cafeteria at lunch time. Pupils can also bring a packed lunch if they prefer. There's a kiosk open for snacks in the breaks, too. Now, I'd like to take you to the IT department where Mr. Sampson will take over.



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
