A short history of Santa Claus

The figure of Santa Claus was brought to America by the Dutch immigrants in the 17th century. The Dutch called him Sintaklaas, the Dutch word for St. Nicholas. Sintaklaas is a figure similar to the Nikolaus we know in Germany. In fact, the two traditions are derived from the same person: the actual St. Nicholas was presumably a bishop in Myra, in Asia Minor, sometime during the 4th century. He was a devoted and generous man, according to tradition he especially enjoyed giving presents to children.

In the USA Santa Claus was not a prominent figure until the novelist Washington
Irving put him in a novel in 1809. Irving's Santa Claus was still called St. Nicholas, but he already smoked a pipe and flew around in a wagon. He did not have reindeer yet. His job was to bring presents to children. It was not until 1863 that Santa Claus got the name he still has today. He then also got his red suit and his reindeers.

Poem: "A Visit from Saint Nicholas" by Clement C. Moore

Before St. Nicholas was renamed as Santa Claus, in 1822 Clement C. Moore composed a poem about St. Nicholas as a gift for his children.


A Visit from Saint Nicholas
