4. What about the tense in the participle clause?

The tense of the participle is neutral. The tense in the participle clause is defined by the main clause.

Ex.: Students who **spend** a year in England **improve** their knowledge of the language.

Students **spending** a year in England **improve** their knowledge of the language.

Students who **spent** a year in England **weren't disappointed.**Students **spending** a year in England **weren't disappointed.**Students who **will spend** a year in England **will come** back as native speakers.

Students **spending** a year in England **will come** back as native speakers.

II. Present Participle clauses after verbs of perception

A present participle clause can be used after verbs of perception in case that the event is not finished.

Verbs of perception are: see, notice, look at, hear, listen to, smell, feel and many others.
