Musterlösung

1. Summarise in how far Britain has changed in the last 50 years regarding immigration. (comprehension)

The newspaper article “London- home to many different cultures” written by an unknown author in 1996, deals with immigration in London in the last 50 years.

Over the last 50 years, Britain and especially London has become a cultural melting pot. The first wave of immigrants from the West Indies has arrived in the 1940s. Since then, London faces an increasing number of immigrants from the West Indies and after WWII also from Asian countries like India and Pakistan. Immigrants mainly come to Britain in hope of a better life. In fact, immigrants in the first generation have experienced unemployment and discrimination. Nowadays, racial discrimination is decreasing, and most immigrants belong to the middle class.

All in all, immigrants still face problems but through sharing their customs, they enrich Britain’s culture and help to build a multi-ethnic society.

2. Explain why so many people came to Britain from the West Indies and compare the situation of the first immigrants with the situation of their grandchildren. (analysis)

Since the first immigrants from the West Indies have arrived in Britain in 1948, many more have followed until today. Still, the first immigrants have faced a different situation than those who come to Britain nowadays. The situation of an immigrant back then compared to today differs in living conditions, job opportunities and discrimination.

First of all, job opportunities for immigrants have changed. During the times the first immigrants arrived in Britain, Britain’s economy was on the rise and there were many job positions available. This attracted many people from the West Indies who did not have a job back home (cf. ll. 9-10). The early immigrants from the West Indies worked in blue-collar jobs and only received the minimum wage in Britain (cf. ll. 8-9). Especially Asians work as skilled workers with high income. As Britain’s economy is not on a rise anymore, unemployment is high in groups of other ethnicities (cf. ll. 21-23).

Depending on the income, working immigrants back then lived under other conditions than immigrants today. In the past, immigrants lived under poor conditions because they could only afford small, crowded houses (cf. l. 14). They formed the lower class of society whereas most immigrants and their offspring belong to the middle class nowadays (cf. ll. 24-25).

In addition, immigrants are confronted with less racial discrimination nowadays than in the past. Today, Britain’s society is diverse, and people are more tolerant (cf. ll. 1-4). Furthermore, immigrants start to identify themselves as British which makes integration easier (cf. ll. 14-15). However, immigrants still face racial discrimination and unequal treatment today (cf. ll. 18-24).

As a conclusion, one can say that the situation for most immigrants has changed to the better over the past years. In general, immigrants have better living conditions, face less racial discrimination and can also fill higher job positions than before. Even though, not everyone is tolerant regarding immigrants and opportunities at the job front have decreased together with Britain’s economy.
