




Cut out the puzzle pieces and put them together correctly. Consider the relevant description underneath.





Meaning and description:

In the upper quarter the Union Jack **symbolizes Australia's historical** links with Great Britain.

The big star at the bottom on the left represents the Commonwealth of Australia with its states and territories. The five smaller stars on the right are placed in the constellation of the Southern Cross. These stars are only visible in the Southern Hemisphere.



Aboriginal music - Spot 10 differences



Assign the following descriptions to the relevant items! Additionally, describe in how far they differ in the pictures.

Clap sticks made of branches were beaten against other objects or against each other accompanying the singing.

Boomerangs, also used as weapons, fulfilled the same purpose.

The skin drum is covered with a piece of lizard skin.

A bullroarer is a piece of wood held into the wind by a string. It produces a roaring sound.

The didgeridoo is made of a hollowed log. It is played through vibrating lips into a mouthpiece made of wax or resin.

A gum leaf is a leaf from a eucalyptus tree which is held against the lips. It produces sounds when it is moved by air pressed through the lips.
