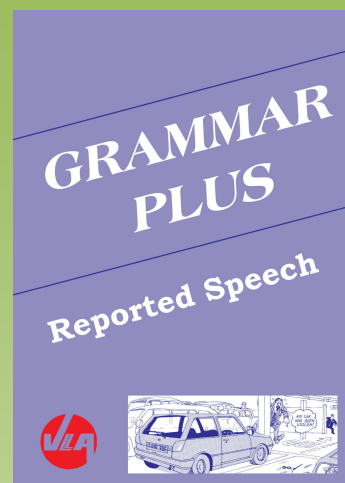

2 Reported Speech

2.1 Reporting Statements



Wenn du berichten willst, was jemand gesagt hat, verwendest du Reported (Indirect) Speech. Was ursprünglich in wörtlicher Rede gesagt wurde, nennen wir Direct Speech.

Beachte bei der Umsetzung in Reported Speech folgendes:

Direct Speech	Reported Speech
Present Simple "Tom is silly."	Past Simple Tim said that Tom was silly.
Present Progressive "George is working."	Past Progressive George was working.
Present Perfect "George has been ill."	Past Perfect George had been ill.
Future with "going to" "George is going to cry."	George was going to cry.
Auxiliaries/Hilfsverben/Future "George will/shall/ can/may go home."	George would/should/ could/might go home.
